Square Weaving Kit Instructions

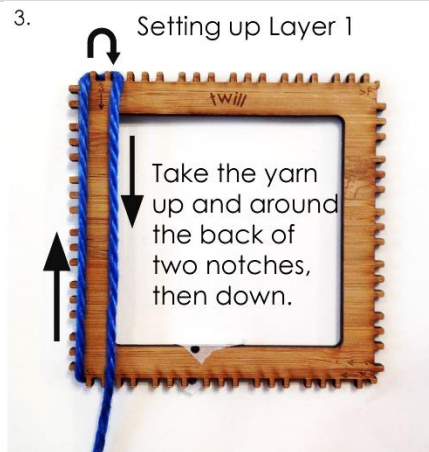
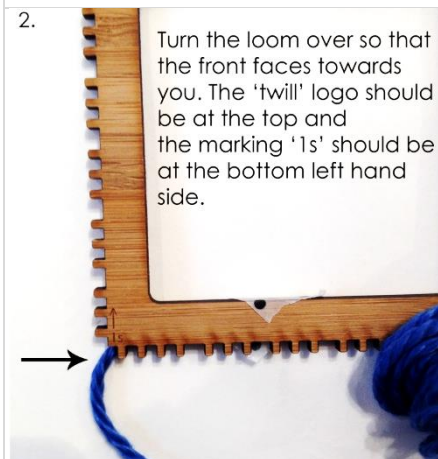
Weave squares & join them together to make beautiful projects and decorations

This little kit includes everything you will need apart from the scissors and a bit of sticky tape.

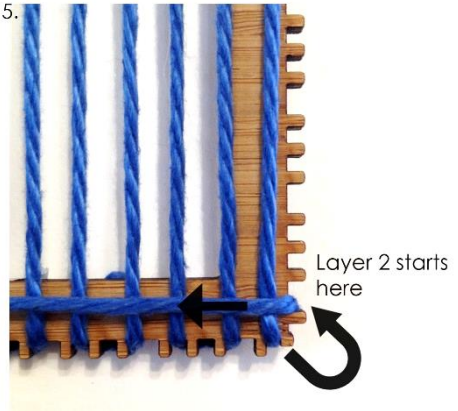
- A 'Twill Textile Design' Square Loom (mini size, tiny or both)
- Approximately 6 meters lengths of DK/8ply/Worsted or similar yarn for each squares (3.5m for the tiny Square) You only need small amounts of each so this is a great activity to use up all those odds and ends. Have lots of fun experimenting with different textures, colours, thicknesses and fibre types!
- A round ended tapestry needle and a crochet hook for finishing off.



4. Continue taking the yarn up and down, but always skip a notch in between

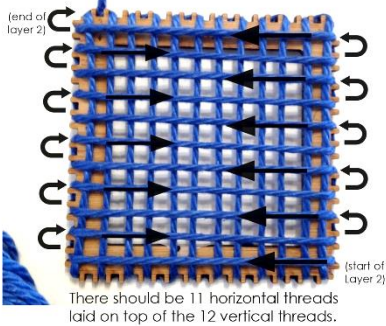

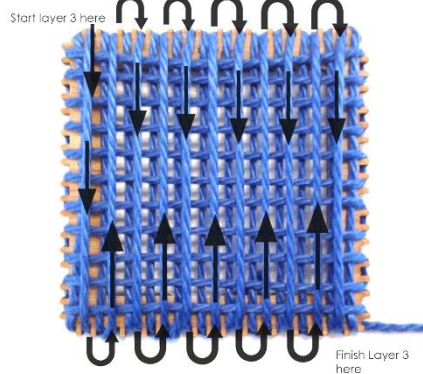


6. Now wind the 2nd Layer at right angles to the 1st layer - from right to left

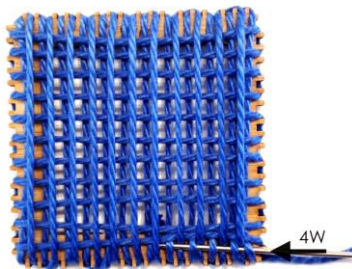
Always skip a groove on each side. Finish layer 2 at the top left and guide the yarn around to marker no 3



7. Now wind Layer 3 on top of the previous two layers - up and down using the available gaps.

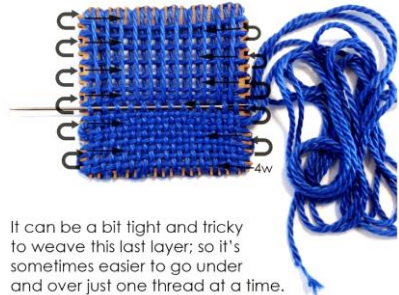


8. Layer 4 is where you start weaving from right to left in the gaps available.

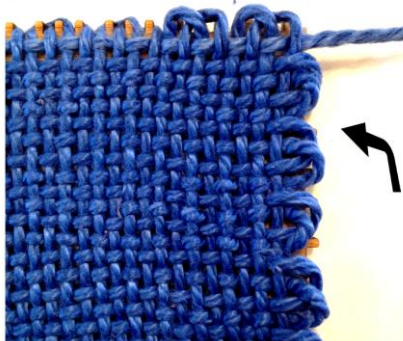


Start at the marker '4w' always under the 1st thread you meet.

9. Now weave 12 rows from side to side - in between the rows of layer number 2 - finish at the top right (F)



10. When you have finished weaving the last row, gently lift the fabric off the frame.

To give the square a nice edge, you will need to crochet around it. Make a slip stitch into each loop and turn each corner with 2 or 3 chain stitches.

Alternatively, you can stitch around the edge using the needle and remaining thread - or weave some more squares and join them together. Finally, sew in the loose ends

12. Crocheting around the edge of the square

Sew in and trim both tail ends to finish off

Use this little square as coaster or turn it into a flower brooch. Or make lots more to join together and make into a purse, blanket, or scarf. You can also use this little loom to create mini tapestries, Christmas trees and other decorations.
